What's Happening at Good Shepherd

Easter 4

April 20/21, 2024

Theme of the Day: The Risen Savior Provides Good Shepherding

Scripture frequently pictures spiritual care in terms of a shepherd watching over sheep. Even folks unfamiliar with shepherding are able to grasp the meaning. Sheep are helpless animals—an easy meal for predators. For sheep to survive they needed a shepherd who not only leads them to sources of food, but who also is willing to tangle with a pack of wolves. Jesus is such a shepherd. He proved he is willing to lay down his life for his sheep.

The word "pastor" comes from the Latin word for "shepherd." Today, there are plenty of people—pastors, religious leaders, etc.—who claim they can provide healing for your soul. Yet, Scripture warns that "many" of these are "false prophets" (1 John 4:1) who "distort the truth" (Acts 20:30). Many! But the resurrection reality is that our Good Shepherd is faithful. He will raise up true sub-shepherds who know Christ and proclaim the truth of his gospel.

Series Theme: Resurrection Reality

St. Paul writes, "Christ has indeed been raised from the dead" (1 Corinthians 15:20). Big word: Indeed! Paul is stressing that we must not think of the Jesus' resurrection like a happy ending to another epic fable. The resurrection is not legend. It really happened. Easter is not just a holiday. Easter is history. On time's infinite line, Jesus' resurrection is the moment that defines reality for us all. If Christ remained dead, he is a fraud and failure. But Christ has indeed been raised. So, the reality: Jesus is exactly what he claimed to be—the Son of God, our Lord and Savior. If Christ remained dead, then the grave is the final, ugly, rotten end of us all. But Christ has indeed been raised. So, the reality is Jesus' resurrection proves that "all will be made alive" (1 Corinthians 15:22). The reality of the resurrection does not just change our future, but the way we look at life now.

The greatest theologian of the early church, Augustine, called the season of Easter "a joyful week of weeks"—seven wonderful weeks, each seven glorious days long. In this glorious season, let us meditate upon the breath-taking implications of the resurrection reality.

2024 April Hymn of the Month #822 Pass Me Not by Fanny J. Crosby

Fanny Jane Crosby (1820-1915) was the author of over 8,500 gospel songs. Blind at six weeks of age, Crosby began composing texts at age 6. The inspiration for this hymn was the result of a visit to a prison during spring 1868. After she had spoken and some of her hymns had been sung, she heard one of the prisoners cry out in a pleading voice, 'Good Lord, do not pass me by'; she wrote a hymn that evening incorporating the line, "Pass me not, O gentle Savior."

Pass me not, O gentle Savior, Hear my humble cry; While on others Thou art calling, Do not pass me by.

Let me at Thy throne of mercy Find a sweet relief; Kneeling there in deep contrition, Help my unbelief.

Savior, Savior, Hear my humble cry; While on others Thou art calling, Do not pass me by.

Trusting only in Thy merit, Would I seek Thy face; Heal my wounded, broken spirit, Save me by Thy grace.

Thou the spring of all my comfort, More than life to me; Whom have I on earth beside Thee? Whom in heaven but Thee?

The Ministry Coordinating Council and Education Ministry Team leaders gathered for our monthly Traction meeting. We welcomed two Good Shepherd members who wanted to observe the meeting.

The majority of time was used to discuss feedback we received over the last 8 days regarding the Blueprint Report. The result of the discussion was to share the entire Blueprint Report with everyone in our community, to delay the Special Voter Assembly one week to Monday Feb 26 at 7pm in the church sanctuary, to go forward with the open forum scheduled this Sunday Feb 18 between services at 9am, and to offer another open forum after the 10:30 worship at 11:30am on Sunday Feb 25.

We all understand how emotionally charged this Blueprint Report is. We need everyone to read the report, take your own notes, so that you can ask questions at the open forums. We believe the best decision is an informed decision versus an emotional decision.

The Blueprint Schools Consultants were given one directive by your leadership: When evaluating the capabilities of our congregation to operate a thriving school, tell us the truth in what you find. Be honest with us, even if it hurts. Please read the report.

We are grateful that the Holy Spirit led our congregation to Crossroads who guided our development of the ministry plan. We are grateful that the Holy Spirit led us to Blueprint Schools who objectively evaluated our capabilities as a congregation to operate our education ministry. And we trust in the Holy Spirit to inspire us to search his Word for truth and meaning for our lives and for his ministry here at Good Shepherd in Downers Grove.

Good Shepherd Giving Tree

The Good Shepherd Giving Tree special needs program:

What is a Giving Tree you might ask?

Giving Tree special needs ("GTSN") are unbudgeted and unplanned items desired by the congregation, sponsored by a Good Shepherd ministry coordinator, and approved by the MCC at any MCC meeting.

Giving Tree special needs funds ("GTF") are funds that are donated to the church by individuals, matching contributions, and third parties to pay for the MCC approved GTSN.

Our Ministry Support leader will collect the information for a GTSN and post it on the bulletin board for all to see. The sponsor of the GTSN will determine if money or a donated item is the best solution to the GTSN.

Once the total amount required to acquire the GTSN item is collected, the sponsor of the GTSN will coordinate with the Treasurer to purchase the item and provide all documentation needed to either be reimbursed or pay the vendor for the item. The GTSN will be removed from the bulletin board by the Ministry Support leader.

Any GTF collected above the amount needed to purchase the GTSN item will be transferred to the general fund of the church after the GTSN has been paid for.

The MCC recently approved a new Giving Tree Special Need:

601 Parsonage remodeling project: Once Ellen Zank moved out of the house at address 601, the property team made a list of projects that are needed to update the property, similar to what was done when Pastor Rutschow retired and moved out of the parsonage next door. The first priority was upgrade the electrical system to modern building codes. That project was completed and paid for with funds in the current maintenance and repairs budget. Next, the bathroom, kitchen, and floors need demolition. Our property team will do that work for free. To complete the remodeling, they need \$23,000 to buy tile, cabinets, fixtures, flooring, paint, etc. The MCC at its December meeting approved placing the funding request on the Giving Tree. We need additional contributions, above what you contribute in regular offerings, so that we can complete the 601 remodeling projects.

Good Shepherd leadership expects that the 601 parsonage will be used to support called workers in 2024.

We pray the Lord will bless this effort with generous gifts.






